## **History/Overview**

2017 marks the 37<sup>th</sup> Season of Scarborough Renaissance Festival<sup>®</sup>. The Festival began on a patch of pasture land and a Pecan Grove with tents and a handful of Renaissance entertainers and artisans. Since that time it has grown to become one of the largest Renaissance Festivals in the United States as well as one of the country's largest outdoor juried craft shows.

## **General Facts**

- Began in 1981
- Scarborough Renaissance Festival<sup>®</sup> is a Renaissance themed festival set in a re-created 16<sup>th</sup> Century English village celebrating the mirth and merriment during the days of King Henry VIII
- The festival runs 8 consecutive weekends and Memorial Day each Spring (April & May)
- One of the largest events and most unique entertainment experiences in North Texas
- One of the largest and most popular Renaissance festivals in the country (consistently voted among the top Renaissance festivals as well as the top of many other categories)
- The "village" of Scarborough is 35 acres (larger than most shopping malls) set within a 155 acre site
- (225) Renaissance style permanent structures
- The festival employs more than 2,000 performers, artisans, food service staff, grounds crew and retail staff approximately half from Waxahachie area and the D/FW Metroplex
- (24) Entertainment stages with more than 300 performers entertaining each day of the Festival
- (155+) Member performing company "the cast of Scarborough" Scarborough Academy of Performing Arts (SAPA)
- (200) Shoppes Scarborough Renaissance Festival<sup>®</sup> is one of the largest outdoor "juried" craft shows in the country
- (150+) Artisans including over twenty Artisans demonstrating their crafts each day of the Festival

- (24) Stages of continuous live entertainment with over 200 performances daily
  - Sword Fighting, Whip Masters, Comedians, Acrobats, Musicians, Singers, Jugglers, Scottish Bagpipes, Magicians, Belly Dancing, Renaissance period instrumentals, Court Dancing, Escape Artist, Flame Throwers, Puppeteers and more

- (155+) Members of the Scarborough Academy of Performing Arts (SAPA) make up the performing company that become the "characters" of Scarborough including our very own King Henry VIII and his sister Queen Margaret, their Courts, the Nobles, Villagers and Peasants.
  - The majority of the SAPA performers are volunteer actors and perform eight consecutive weekends of 10 hours a day, outdoor improvisational theater on our 35 acre stage
  - o SAPA conducts eight weeks of rigorous training and rehearsals prior to the festival
  - A number of performances and activities also involve SAPA members: Children's Knighting Ceremony; The Human Chess Match; History, Customs & Manners Show; Maypole Dance/Ceremony; Court & Country Dances and more.
  - Many SAPA performers have been in "character" for many years. In fact King Henry VIII is celebrating his 22<sup>nd</sup> year in the role and Queen Margaret is celebrating her 20<sup>th</sup> year!



## Visual Artwork, Crafts & Demonstrations

Scarborough Renaissance Festival<sup>®</sup> is one the largest outdoor juried craft shows in the country and is the place to go to discover the most unique artwork and handmade crafts in North Texas. The Festival has 200 Shoppes featuring one-of-a-kind treasures for every taste and budget. Many of the artisans demonstrate their crafts throughout the days of the Festival and/or are on hand to talk about the outstanding workmanship and unusual techniques that go into creating every piece.

- **Glass Works** Full glassblowing and glass sculpting studios at the festival. Blown glass (glasses, mugs, bowls, etc), sculpted glass figurines, jewelry, stained glass, cut glass and more
- Painters & other visual artists paintings, charcoals, handmade books, etc.
- Sculpting Life castings, intricate stone & wax carvings
- Jewelry Precious stones, intricate beadworks, gold & silver masterpieces, chainmaille, crowns & tiaras
- **Pottery -** figurines plus functional pieces bowls, mugs, pitchers & more
- **Woodworking** musical instruments, carvings, mugs, bowls, walking sticks, treasure boxes, wands, model ships, toys, whistles, swords, bows, etc
- **Metalsmithing** operational forge & blacksmithing shoppes at the festival with daily demonstrations with pewter, cast iron & steel. Household wares, wine racks, head boards, figurines, etc. Plus, swords & knives
- Clothiers, Leatherworks & Hammock Weaving
  - Fine, handmade clothing weaving, needlepoint, silk works, cotton, wool & more
  - Clothing: dresses, capes, corsets, shirts, wraps, period attire, kilts, footwear, etc.
  - o Accessories: scarves, belts, woven bags, leather pouches, wallets, purses, head-ware, parasols, etc
  - Household items: hammocks, pennants & tabards
- **Miscellaneous** Soaps, Perfumes, lotions, oils, incense, dolls, handmade/painted masks, Ocarinas, hand fans, fairy wings and much, much more
